




Public Recreation and Conservation Values

Estimated Cost and Proposed Funding

Based on independent appraisal to highest (federal) standards

Newfields 101 acres: \$3,525,000 Exeter 47 acres: \$1,642,000 Total: \$5,166,000


For Newfields: 2-3 public (state and federal) grants proposed, awards up to \$1.6 million

Remaining \$1.9 to \$2.4 million proposed to be town bond or loan

Timeline and Next Steps

Fall: additional public meeting/s, continue grant applications

March 2024: public vote/ referendum on town bond or loan
